

TEN COMMANDMENTS OF SUPERVISION-IN-PRACTICE

Apprentices work with and balance several relationships during the course of their apprenticeship experience...

- 1. The apprentice is, first of all, accountable to him/her self in ensuring that primary relationships and responsibilities of life are enhanced by the apprenticeship experience.
- 2. The apprentice is responsible to the usual norms of accountability and supervision within his/her profession and place of practice [either as employee or volunteer].
- The Covenant of The Anamcara Project articulates the rationale and spirituality of the
 apprenticeship experience; the four pillars of the Tradition are the basis of all
 apprenticeship practices: Soulfulness, Community, Skillfulness and Mentorship.
- **4.** The apprentice holds in sacred trust those whom they serve □ to do no harm and wherever possible, to support the healing process.
- 5. The monthly Ceili De group meeting is an opportunity for peer-to-peer support and consultation.
- **6.** The Animator for the Ceili De, while not a supervisor, is nevertheless expected to assist as a liaison of communication between apprentices and the Leadership Team of the **Anamcara Project.**
- 7. The mentor/s for each program track have a special relationship to apprentices in providing program teachings and recommending appropriate 'best practices.'
- **8.** The Leadership Team of the **Anamcara Project** hold a special responsibility for the well-being of the overall program philosophy and content.
- **9.** If necessary, a physician-consultant for the *Sacred Art of Living Center* is available for issues related to bio-medical concerns or practices.
- **10.** Whenever possible, should conflicts arise within or between these relationships, the Leadership Team of the **Anamcara Project** is to be consulted.
