PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD

Prayers for the dead, and working spiritually for the dead, formed a very great part of the Céile Dé tradition in ancient times. Life circumstances always brings us times when it may be a practice that we are called to engage in, either alone or as a part of a Céile Dé group.

This prayer in Irish Gaelic is typical of what is traditionally chanted within the three day period immediately after someone has passed over. It is, as the words show, a blessing to aid the soul on its journey. It is also traditionally sung at Samhain time.

The style, if sung in a group is that of call and response.
